

Minutes of the Coconino Amateur Radio Club

11/9/2017

Meeting Started: 7:00 pm

Presentation: DX Engineering provided a talk on various antenna configurations via Skype, presented by Tim Duffy. It was a good review of the various types of antennas and their uses for both HF and VHF.

Secretary's Report: Since the minutes of the October meeting were published in the newsletter, there was no need to read them. Gary Loving made a motion to accept the minutes and Joe Hobart seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Pat Traber, our CARC Treasurer, reported that the closing bank balance is \$2,225.66 Membership is still 51 members, consisting of 47 paid members and 4 lifetime members. Pat gave us a review of costs for the CARC Radio Trailer. The trailer cost was \$2,335.76 and the equipment cost was \$2246.04 for a total of \$4,581.80. Janice Enloe moved to accept the Treasurer's Report and Bobbi Brunner seconded the motion. The report was approved unanimously.

President's Report: Tom Shehan, our CARC President, was not in attendance this month. Dan Shearer, our newly elected Vice President, opened the business meeting with an introduction of all members.

Old Business: Dan asked for an update of the new trailer. Ken Held, who spent a great deal of time installing the wiring, antennas and radios gave us a quick rundown of the capabilities and placement of the antennas and radios. The membership gave Ken a big THANK YOU for all the work he did.

Dan opened a discussion of the Public Information Officer position which remains open. After some discussion, Dan announced that he would accept the position but would like to have 1 or 2 assistants for large projects like Field Day.

Dan reminded us that once again there will be a Winter Field Day event on January 27, 2018. It can be entered as an individual from home stations or as a club. To find out more, Google "Winter Field Day". It's a good opportunity to sharpen up our skills for the ARRL Field Day Event.

Vice President's Report: No Vice President Report this month.

50/50 Raffle: Gary Loving won the 50/50 raffle.

New Business: Joe told us that he was approached concerning the maintenance and operation of the South Rim of the Grand Canyon Repeater, (which used to be part of the North Link). The current operators, (Zantara), would like to find a new group to run it. Niles Radio currently performs maintenance on other equipment in the vicinity. They told Joe that the Antenna may be a problem and that access to the site would have to be worked out. Joe recommended that we table the discussion until the January meeting and pay a visit to the site to inspect the equipment and talk about access requirements. Everyone agreed with the recommendation.

Dan brought up the topic of asking for a volunteer for our Training/Education Coordinator. Glen Davis said he would be interested. He also thanked Ron Gerlak, Jack Lundsford, Phil Brunner for helping with the classes they held in Williams recently. We talked about picking dates for our next classes and whether to hold a General License class this year. No firm decisions were made and this will be carried over until the January meeting.

ARES Report:

Joe reported that the first EOC test session on 10/10 went very well. They ran RF through the new coax cables that were installed. They put up an Alpha/Delta Antenna and tuned it. They discovered that 40 meters was not good, they need a 60 meter dipole.

The full EOC activation was held on 10/19 and was a good practice. Participants were Joe, Gary, Mark, Ken, Jodi, Lena and Joe supervised. They used 40 and 80 meters, both of which had good propagation.

Joe said that there is a Full Scale State Exercise scheduled for May 21-24th 2018. They will use the main EOC in the LEAF and we may take our CARC Trailer or it could be just City and County exercise.
